The Lydian Scale

Ted Greene 1975-07-25

This scale is a major scale with a #4 (+11). The fingerings are the same as those for a *Major Scale whose root is a 5th higher*. In other words, these are the sounds you have been using for the $IV\Delta 7$, $IV\Delta 9$, etc., already, in major keys.

The Lydian scale is also a choice sound to use on real major chords (not disguised dominants) such as \flat II, \flat VI, and \flat VII. Lydian's even sound good on I, if you want a more exotic sound. The sound conveyed from the Lydian scale are the 6/9#11, major 7#11, major 9#11, and major 13#11 among others.


Lydian Scale

For use with all major chords (real majors) that are not acting as I chords – and also even on these too.


The arpeggios for this scale are exactly the same as those found on the IV chord in a major key, namely: major 7, major 9, add 9 (/9), 6, major 9#11, major 13#11. (Refer back to major scale arpeggio sheet if you are in doubt.)

Chords for visualizing:




Miscellaneous Fact:

A Harmonic Minor [scale] with a #4 is called a Hungarian Minor – sounds conveyed are minor $\Delta 7$, minor $\Delta 9$ with an exotic flavor.

The LYDIAN SCALE

This scale is a major scale with a #4(+11). The fingerings are the same as those for a MADER Scale whose root is a 5th higher in other words, these are the sounds you have been using for the IV7, IV9 etc. already, in major keys, The Lydian Scale is also a choice sound to use on real major chords (not disguised dominants) such as 6II, 6III, 6II and bIII. Lydian's even sound good on I, if you want a more exotic sound.

The sounds conveyed from the Lydian scale are the 6/9+11, 7+11, 9+11 and +3+11 among others.



(For use with all major chords (REAL MAJORS)
that me not acting as I chords-and also
even on these too).

The arpeggiose for this scale are exactly the
same as those found on the TV chord in a
major key, manely: 7, 2, 19, 6, 2+11, +3+11

(Refer back to major scale arpeggio sheet if you
are in doubt).

MISCELLANEOUS FACT:

a harmonic minor with a #4 is called a HUNGARIAN MINOR- sounds conveyed are m7, m9 with an exotic flavor.
