

Exotic Scales

Two examples given for each scale: starting on C, and starting on D

- 1) Algerian (1, 2, b3, #4, 5, b6, 7, 1, 2, b3, 4)



11) Hungarian (1, #2, 3, #4, 5, 6, b7) [also known as Hungarian Major]




12) Hungarian Gypsy (1, 2, b3, #4, 5, b6, 7) [also known as Hungarian Minor]

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15) Chinese (1, 3, #4, 5, 7)
